This report represents some events the Office of Law Enforcement (OLE) handled over the last couple of weeks; however, it does not include all actions taken by the OLE.

Northwest Zone – Captain Laura Petreikis

District 1 – Sgt. Tony Petreikis

(Counties: Carroll, Henry, JoDaviess, Lee, Mercer, Ogle, Rock Island, Stephenson & Whiteside)

CARROLL COUNTY

No activity reported for this county.

HENRY COUNTY

CPO Posateri collected a dead bald eagle that was hit by a car. It will be relayed to the US Fish and Wildlife Service and then forwarded to the National Eagle Repository. Eagles and eagle parts are available only to Native Americans enrolled in federally recognized tribes for use in religious and cultural ceremonies.

CPO Posateri issued three violations to drivers for going around road closed signs that were placed because of flash flooding of the Green River.

JODAVIESS COUNTY

CPO Hoftender completed an administrative deer investigation. She determined that the Galena man had used another Galena man's deer permit because he did not want to use his either sex tag. The subject who loaned the deer permit was issued a citation for hunting without a valid permit, and the other subject was issued a citation for unlawful possession of an illegally taken deer. Parts of the deer were seized. Warnings were issued for falsification, failure to take the deer to the check station, and failure to tag immediately upon kill.

LEE COUNTY

OGLE COUNTY

While on patrol in White Pines Forest State Park, CPO Teas discovered three subjects sitting in a parked vehicle smoking cannabis. One of the subjects also had an active warrant for his arrest. The subject wanted on the warrant was transported to the Ogle County Jail, and civil citations were issued for the cannabis.

District 6 – Sgt. Phil Wire

(Counties: Boone, Bureau, DeKalb, LaSalle, Putnam & Winnebago)

BOONE COUNTY

CPO Alt checked sport ice fishermen at several areas. Violations of fishing license not in possession and unsigned fishing license were detected and addressed.

BUREAU COUNTY

While conducting traffic enforcement, CPO Wagner issued a citation to the driver of a logging truck for failure to show proof of ownership. Citations were also issued for speeding violations.

While on patrol, CPO Wagner found a vehicle parked in a remote location. After stopping to check on occupants, he observed two male subjects in possession of cannabis. Appropriate enforcement action was taken.

DEKALB COUNTY

While working at Shabbona Lake State Recreation Area, CPO Murry observed three fishermen approximately 300 yards from the campground setting up their ice fishing equipment and drilling holes in the ice. This site does not open until 8 a.m. in the month of March. A fishing compliance check was conducted. One of the fishermen was on his phone, and he said that he was unable to get a license because the state system was down. While writing the three fishermen citations for the violation of the posted closing period of the site, the one fisherman was able to purchase his license while waiting on his ticket.

In a separate incident, CPO Murry arrived at Shabbona Lake around 7:15 a.m. and observed an ice fishing shanty set up approximately 300 yards from the bait store. He spoke with the fishermen and informed them the reason for the stop. They stated they did not see the three different signs they passed, as well as one they were parked right next to, showing the hours the site was opened. When explaining they would be getting citations for the violation, one of the fishermen became extremely belligerent and vocal. CPO Murry, along with one of the fishing partners, asked him to calm down multiple times. After the man became more belligerent, CPO Murry warned him that he would be evicted from the park if he did not calm down. The man then began cursing and yelling more. CPO Murry advised him he was evicted from the park for 90 days, and he was served with an eviction notice.

LASALLE COUNTY

CPOs Wagner and Kaufman cited four individuals for ice climbing in a nature preserve.

CPO Wagner received a complaint that someone was feeding deer. During the investigation, antler traps baited with corn were found on the property. A citation was issued for the offense.

While on patrol, CPO Wagner issued several speeding citations for speeds in excess of 75 mph.

CPO Kaufman was traveling on Interstate 80 after sunset when he came upon a vehicle with no lights on. He conducted a traffic stop to inform the driver to turn their vehicle's lights on. The driver did not have a valid driver's license; and his driving privileges have been revoked since 1994. The driver was arrested, and vehicle was towed since he was the only person in the vehicle.

Starved Rock State Park allows ice climbing in four of its 16 major canyons. Park rules state that individuals must sign in and out of those four canyons. CPO Kaufman and Wagner found four individuals ice climbing in a prohibited canyon. Four citations were issued.

CPO Kaufman attended a five-day water survival instructor course in Barrington.

PUTNAM COUNTY

CPO Finn traveled to Decatur where he assisted in training the new recruits in proper firearm handling and qualifications.

WINNEBAGO COUNTY

While on patrol at Rock Cut State Park, CPO Wagner stopped a suspicious vehicle near the campground entrance. It was determined that the driver was driving without a valid driver's license. The subject was cited for the violation, and a licensed driver was called to pick up the vehicle.

CPO Alt is investigating deer harvest record complaints from the 2018 deer hunting season. A Winnebago County man was found to have unlawfully harvested a large white-tailed buck without a deer permit. Other violations addressed included unlawful taking of a protected species, unlawful hunting white-tailed deer without a deer permit, and falsification/misrepresentation of a deer harvest record.

While conducting fish enforcement, CPO Alt found an individual fishing without a fishing license. A second subject was fishing without a fishing license in possession. Appropriate enforcement action was taken.

District 7 – Sgt. Scott Avery

(Counties: Fulton, Henderson, Knox, Marshall, McDonough, Peoria, Stark, Tazewell, Warren & Woodford)

FULTON COUNTY

CPO Thompson investigated potential permit violations committed during the 2018 archery deer season. He received a confession to failure to tag deer immediately upon kill and unlawful hunting without valid permits. Appropriate enforcement action was taken.

CPO Thompson investigated a Canton man for the unlawful take of a white-tailed deer during the 2018 firearm deer season. He received a confession to failure to tag deer immediately upon kill and unlawful possession of illegally taken deer. Appropriate enforcement action was taken.

CPO Thompson conducted waterfowl enforcement. He observed hunters deposit their cigarette butts on the ground on several occasions. Written warnings were issued for littering and failure to sign in/sign out at the check station.

HENDERSON COUNTY

KNOX COUNTY

CPO Elliott completed an investigation into the unlawful take and failure to tag a deer immediately upon kill. The subject admitted to not possessing a permit when he shot a doe this past archery deer season. Appropriate enforcement action was taken.

MARSHALL COUNTY

MCDONOUGH COUNTY

CPO Elliott attended a career fair at Western Illinois University. He answered questions and provided information to those interested in becoming a CPO.

CPO Elliott completed an investigation into a subject who failed to tag his deer immediately upon kill. The subject explained he did not want to use his either sex permit, so he purchased an additional antlerless only permit long after taking and transporting the deer. Appropriate enforcement action was taken.

PEORIA COUNTY

CPO Lazzell received a case disposition regarding a nonresident hunter from Tennessee who had provided false information to the IDNR to obtain Illinois resident firearm deer permits. The Tennessee man pled guilty to hunting without a valid deer permit and was ordered to pay a fine of \$977.

CPO Lazzell received a case disposition regarding a Peoria County hunter who was charged with criminal trespass to private property and hunting without permission of the landowner during the 2018 archery deer season. The Chillicothe man pled guilty to hunting without permission of the landowner and was ordered to pay a fine of \$856.

WOODFORD COUNTY

CPO Gerard received a court disposition stemming from a hunting without permission complaint during firearm deer season. Two individuals were found guilty and ordered to each pay \$1,200.

ADAMS COUNTY

CPO Blazinic attended a hunter safety class at Payson Grade School. There were 26 students in the class.

BROWN COUNTY

GREENE COUNTY

CPO Goetten responded to a complaint of coyote hunters trespassing on private property. Upon arriving in the area, one suspect vehicle was stopped. Both occupants possessed uncased firearms, and both were issued citations. Several other members of the hunting party were identified. Enforcement action for hunting on property without permission is pending investigation.

CPO Goetten received a disposition in a case. He had cited three subjects for the unlawful take of a deer. One subject cooperated with the investigation, while the other two did not. Each pled guilty. They were fined \$316, \$316, and \$195.

CPO Goetten attended a hunter safety course in Greenfield.

HANCOCK COUNTY

CPO Wheatley attended a water survival instructor course. He will now be able to teach other CPOs how to save themselves should they find themselves in the water both with and without a PFD.

JERSEY COUNTY

CPO Lentz issued a citation to a commercial fisherman for stretching his net more than halfway across Otter Creek.

CPO Gotten received a disposition regarding a subject arrested twice in two days for drug possession. The man pled guilty. His total fines and costs were \$982.

CPO Goetten investigated a Georgia resident for falsifying information to obtain resident deer permits. The subject was charged in Johnson County with the assistance of CPO Johnson. He pled guilty and was fined \$1,613.

CPO Goetten received a disposition regarding two West Virginia hunters and one Indiana hunter illegally taking deer. All three subjects were charged in Clark County. Two pled guilty to charges resulting in \$1,200 fines. The third subject was charged with taking a buck illegally in Indiana as a result of the investigation.

MACOUPIN COUNTY

CPO Lentz conducted a deer permit investigation and issued a citation to a male subject for failure to tag deer immediately upon kill.

CPO Goetten attended a hunter safety course in Carlinville.

PIKE COUNTY

CPO Blazinic received a complaint regarding an individual keeping two live snow geese in a dog pen in their backyard. The geese had originally been taken in Pike County but relocated to a residence in Adams County. CPO Blazinic and Quincy Police Department Animal Control seized the snow geese. The geese had been shot with lead shot and each had a broken wing. The geese were transported to Western Illinois Veterinary Clinic where they were euthanized. CPO Blazinic located the individual responsible and issued four citations for the offenses. Two of the citations were for unlawfully taking an animal out of the wild and retaining it alive. The other two citations were for unlawfully using lead/toxic shot on migratory waterfowl.

CPO Blakeley assisted with a trapper safety class held at Gardner Camp. The safety class was sponsored by the Illinois Trappers Association. The class certified over 60 students, of which the majority were youth. The class was extremely hands on with numerous demonstrations. The students were given traps and lure, along with a free membership to the Illinois Trappers Association. He also spoke to the young hunters about a career path as a CPO.

CPO Blazinic received a complaint regarding a timber dispute. Two timber buyers supposedly purchased the same timber. The investigation is ongoing.

CPO Wichern issued two fishermen citations at Sangchris Lake for the unlawful possession of three undersized crappie. In a separate incident, CPO Wichern issued two fishermen at Sangchris Lake citations for the unlawful possession of two undersized crappie and one undersized largemouth bass.

The subjects said they were involved in an argument with the complainant and admitted to using the complainant's property without permission. Each hunter was issued a citation.

SCOTT COUNTY

A disposition was received in a case involving a commercial fisherman from Schuyler County that was charged by CPOs Blakeley and Wichern. The fisherman was found guilty in a Scott County Court for failing to check his hoop net for over 144 hours. The guilty verdict will result in his loss of any state commercial fishing contracts for a period of one year.

CPO Kelley responded to a call regarding a large quantity of clippings from cannabis plants being dumped at Moraine Hills State Park. The investigation is ongoing.

KANKAKEE COUNTY

CPOs Farber and Reid conducted firearms training for the CPO Trainees.

Sgt. Wollgast and the Limestone and Essex fire departments responded to a report of someone falling through the ice at Mazonia. Upon arrival, they found two dogs on the ice; and no one was in the water. The dogs had been missing from their residence for several days. The owner arrived and was able to call one of the dogs off the melting ice. The other dog had to be rescued by the Limestone Fire Department's airboat.

CPO Bergland attended water survival instructor training, and he learned to train current and future CPOs on techniques to help save them when falling in the water or being in a confrontation in the water.

COOK COUNTY

While traveling on Lake Shore Drive, CPO Stanbary observed a vehicle run a red light. When he caught up to the driver at the next intersection, he noticed that the driver was texting on his phone while driving in traffic. A traffic stop was conducted, and the driver was issued a citation for disregarding a traffic control device. A written warning was issued for unlawful use of an electronic communication device.

CPOs Stanbary and Mooi attended a week-long water survival instructor course at Barrington High School. The CPOs were certified as instructors and will share the knowledge and new survival skills learned with fellow officers around the state.

CPO Stanbary gave a presentation to a large group of young hunters at a hunter safety class in Bridgeview. He shared important information with the students about hunter safety and rules relating to hunting wildlife in Illinois.

CPO Stanbary stopped a driver after he observed the driver maneuver onto a raised median and pass multiple cars stopped for a red light. When the light changed, the driver aggressively merged back into traffic and nearly caused a collision. The driver was issued a citation for improper lane usage.

While conducting ice fishing enforcement, CPO Mooi issued a written warning for too many devices.

CPO Sanford conducted a deer investigation stemming from a potential permit violation. Upon completion of the interview of the suspected violator, he determined the subject unlawfully harvested a white-tailed doe without a valid permit. The subject purchased a permit, tagged the deer, and reported the harvest after the fact. The individual was issued a citation and two written warnings for the violations.

CPO Mooi assisted the DuPage County Forest Preserve Police with a hunting without permission investigation. Charges are pending.

CPO Reeves served as a defensive tactics instructor at the IDNR Academy.

District 11 – Sgt. Brian McReynolds

(Counties: Clark, Coles, Cumberland, Douglas, Edgar, Moultrie & Shelby)

CLARK COUNTY

CPO Wellum stopped a timber truck and completed a timber truck inspection. The driver was issued a written warning for incomplete paperwork.

CPO Greuel cited a Clark County man for failure to maintain records required by a furbearer breeder permittee.

COLES COUNTY

CPO Mieure attended a trapper education course.

CPO Mieure came upon a pickup truck stuck along a dead-end road, and the subject stated he had gotten off the side of the roadway because he had to swerve for a deer. The truck had become stuck in the ditch, and the driver had a friend attempting to winch him out with another truck. Both vehicles caused major ruts to the roadway. CPO Mieure contacted the road commissioner and the property owner to see what actions they wanted taken. The Charleston man was issued a written warning for damage to government supported property, and he agreed to return to the location with his tractor to fix the damage to the roadway and the ditch. The subject was given phone numbers to the landowner and road commissioner, and he will contact them once the repairs are completed.

CPO Moody received a disposition involving a case of trespass to harvest ginseng and harvesting ginseng without a harvest license. The Charleston man pled guilty to both charges and was fined \$628, and he was placed on six-month supervision. The 90-day jail sentence was stayed.

CPO Mieure closed a 2012 case involving possession of drug paraphernalia. The Charleston man pled guilty in 2018. He was fined \$800 and confined eight days in jail.

CPO Wellum received a complaint of illegal trapping; and when he arrived on scene, he located a raccoon in a trap on the property. The property owner did not have a nuisance permit. The subject was issued a citation for trapping out of season.

CPO Greuel completed integrated force options instructor certification.

Sgt. McReynolds assisted the Shelby County Sheriff's Office with perimeter security after a Tower Hill man ran from a deputy attempting to serve a felony arrest warrant.

CPO Greuel assisted with waterfowl scenarios at the IDNR Academy.

CPO Moody received a disposition in a case involving illegal dumping in Hidden Springs State Forest. The Shelbyville man pled guilty, paid a fine of \$377, and paid restitution for an extra trash pickup by the garbage service.

District 13 – Sgt. Eric Manker

(Counties: Bond, Clinton, Madison, Monroe, Montgomery, Randolph, St. Clair & Washington)

BOND COUNTY

CPO Lentz cited a Florida resident for claiming Illinois residency and taking two does and a ten-point buck. The buck was seized, and several citations were issued to him for unlawful taking of deer and permit fraud.

CLINTON COUNTY

CPO Lentz issued a citation to a commercial fisherman for fishing in a restricted area on Carlyle Lake.

CPO Tapley, along with other CPOs, taught defensive tactics to the recruits at the IDNR Academy.

MADISON COUNTY

CPO Goetten received a disposition in a case regarding a subject arrested for DUI, driving while license revoked, child endangerment, and several other charges. The subject pled guilty. His total fines and costs were \$1,500.

CPO Schachner received an “after-the-fact” complaint of illegal snagging that took place on the Mississippi River. While scouting the area, he located several vehicles parked in an unusual location. He discovered two fishermen snagging fish. The fishermen were apprehended, and they possessed a total of 26 catfish which they snagged illegally. The largest catfish was approximately 25 pounds, and the total weight of all the fish was approximately 250 pounds. Both fishermen were cited for illegally snagging fish, and the seized fish were donated to six different needy families in the immediate area.

MONROE COUNTY

No activity reported for this county.

MONTGOMERY COUNTY

CPO Lentz attended the water survival instructor training class in Barrington.

CPO Lentz issued a citation to a subject at Coffeen Lake for keeping a crappie less than ten inches.

CPO Goetten received a complaint of a subject selling deer meat. The suspect was identified and interviewed. He admitted to the violation. The deer were harvested in Arkansas. Additional violations were also discovered during the investigation, and the Arkansas Department of Natural Resources was notified. CPO Goetten seized an illegally taken bear hide, skull, and claws. Several pounds of deer meat were also seized. Enforcement action is pending in Illinois and Arkansas.

CPO Tapley attended a hunter safety course. There were 26 students in the class.

RANDOLPH COUNTY

CPO Sievers completed an investigation into hunter interference and harassment of waterfowl which involved the use of an airplane. The pilot was flushing waterfowl from the ground until the waterfowl were gone. The pilot then flew extremely close and in front of the hunters who were hunting from a boat before leaving the area. The pilot was issued citations for hunter interference and harassment of waterfowl using an airplane.

ST. CLAIR COUNTY

CPO Ray arrested a subject for the use of two deer stands on Peabody River King, failure to remove stands for two years, and affixing a device into the bark of the tree.

CPO Ray attended a hunter safety course. There were approximately 45 students in the class.

CPO Ray completed a water survival instructor training course.

CPO Sievers located a boat and fishermen in the hot water discharge channel at Baldwin Lake. This area is posted as a restricted area. The boat inspection revealed that there were not enough serviceable life jackets on the boat. The fishermen did not have any fish. A citation for the life jacket violation was issued, and written warnings were issued for being in the restricted area.

WASHINGTON COUNTY

CPO Sievers received a complaint from a landowner that he had several walnut trees cut down on his property. The trees were very close to a county roadway, and no neighboring timber was being harvested. The investigation is ongoing.

District 14 – Sgt. Jeff Cariens (Counties: Franklin, Gallatin, Hamilton, Hardin, Jefferson, Pope, Saline & White)

FRANKLIN COUNTY

CPO Williams assisted the Franklin County Sheriff's Department with an armed, suicidal subject.

GALLATIN COUNTY

CPOs Haggerty and Williams assisted the Illinois State Police during a search for a missing person. During the search, the CPOs used ATVs and a remote-controlled sonar unit.

HAMILTON COUNTY

CPO Folden has been actively involved in the training of the newest IDNR Recruit Class at the Macon County Law Enforcement Academy in Decatur.

HARDIN COUNTY

CPO Johnson received a tip regarding the illegal take of otters in Illinois. The caller reported that he overheard a conversation regarding a subject bragging that he was harvesting way too many otters and was purchasing additional otter permits in someone else's name. In Illinois, a trapper is allowed five otters per season. CPO Johnson investigated the report, and he discovered pertinent information. He interviewed the subject at his house, and the subject admitted to taking too many otters. A search of his freezer revealed 11 untagged otters. CPO Johnson asked what was at the bottom of the freezer, and four illegally taken bobcats were found. A further investigation revealed the subject was attempting to sell the pelts. In total, 12 otters and four bobcats were seized. CPO Johnson contacted a trapper who agreed to skin and dry out the pelts to prevent the animals from being wasted. CPOs Johnson and Haggerty met with the subject the following day. The following enforcement action was taken: four citations for unlawful take of four bobcats; four citations for unlawful take of 12 otters; one citation for fraudulent use of another's otter permit; and two charges of resource theft. Any potential felony charges will be referred to the State's Attorney.

WHITE COUNTY

CPO Taylor received a complaint of commercial fishermen taking undersized catfish. When he arrived at the location, he observed one boat loaded with Asian carp, carp, and 15 legal catfish. The two subjects on board both had a commercial fishing license. The two subjects stated they had two other boats at another boat ramp nearby. He informed the two commercial fishermen that they needed to have one commercial fisherman per boat. The operators of the other boats were issued citations for not having a commercial fishing license.
