

SUMMARY OF 2006-2007 ILLINOIS DEER SEASONS

General Information

Season Dates:

Archery Season – October 1, 2006 through January 11, 2007, closed during firearm deer season in counties open to firearm deer hunting

Youth Season – October 7-8, 2006

Firearm Season – November 17-19; November 30-December 3, 2006

Muzzleloader Season – December 8-10, 2006 (also allowed November 30-December 3)

Late-Winter Antlerless Season/CWD Season – January 12-14, 2007

Total Days of Deer Hunting: 106

Bag Limit: One deer per legal permit, with no set limit for total number of deer allowed. No more than 2 antlered deer during the year, except additional antlered deer may be taken during the special CWD season only.

Significant Changes: (1) Hunters with unfilled permits for the Firearm Deer Season or the Muzzleloader Deer Season were allowed to use these permits during the Late Winter Deer Season to harvest antlerless deer, so long as the permit was issued for a county open to that season; (2) the single either-sex archery deer permit was discontinued (previously available only to residents) but a single antlerless-only archery permit was available OTC without limit to both residents and nonresidents.


Harvest Reporting: Successful deer hunters were required to register their harvest by 10 p.m. on the same calendar day as the deer was taken by using an automated harvest reporting system (telephone or internet). The only exception to automated harvest reporting occurred in select northern Illinois counties during the firearm and special chronic wasting disease (CWD) deer seasons, where mandatory check stations were staffed by IDNR biologists to collect tissue samples for CWD surveillance.



Permitting

IDNR's Permit Office issued 589,379 deer permits for all seasons, including both lottery-issued permits and over-the-counter permits. The number of permits issued increased for all seasons except the Late Winter Season.

2006 Archery Deer Season Results

Length: 103 days (96 days in counties open to firearm deer hunting)

Number of Counties Open: 102

Special Regulations: Resident combination permits (one either-sex and one antlerless-only tag) available over-the-counter (OTC) in unlimited quantities. Nonresident combination permits were limited to a quota of 20,000 and issued via lottery. Single antlerless-only permits were available to both resident and nonresident hunters OTC without limit. Single either-sex permits were no longer available this year (previously available only to resident hunters).





Length: 7 days (split; one 3-day [Fri-Sun] + one 4-day [Thu-Sun] segment)

Number of Counties Open: 99 (closed in Cook, DuPage, Lake)

Special Regulations: County-specific (or special hunt area-specific) permits issued via lotteries from IDNR Permit Office. Mandatory check stations in effect for seven northern Illinois counties (Stephenson, Winnebago, Boone, McHenry, Ogle, DeKalb, Kane) for chronic wasting disease surveillance; other counties used automated harvest reporting.

Weather Conditions: Favorable first season; second season $\geq 12''$ snow fell in central and northern Illinois and 6"-12" to the south, as well as temperatures 13.5° below normal and sleet/freezing rain causing some power outages.

Corn Harvest: 95% complete statewide by beginning of season





Special Regulations: Antlerless-only; participation limited to youths under the age of 16. One county-specific permit per hunter issued via lottery from IDNR Permit Office. Hunters must be accompanied by responsible supervising adult.





2006 Muzzleloader Deer Season Results

Length: 3 days

Number of Counties Open: 99 (closed in Cook, DuPage, Lake)

Special Regulations: County-specific (or special hunt area-specific) permits issued via lotteries from IDNR Permit Office. Hunters with muzzleloader permits were also allowed to hunt with a muzzleloader during the 2nd Firearm Deer Season (4 days). Recipients of landowner permits (for their own property only) valid during the Firearm Deer Season could use those unfilled permits during the Muzzleloader Deer Season so long as they used a muzzleloading rifle.





2006-2007 Late-Winter Deer Season Results

Length: 3 days

Number of Counties Open: 67 (51 in previous year)

Special Regulations: Legal weapons were shotguns, muzzleloaders, or handguns (this season was limited to handguns prior to the January 2005 season). County-specific antlerless-only permits issued via lottery to Illinois residents from IDNR Permit Office. NEW: Hunters with unfilled permits for the Firearm Deer Season or the Muzzleloader Deer Season were allowed to use these permits during the Late Winter Deer Season to harvest antlerless deer, so long as the permit was issued for an open county. Persons using an unfilled Muzzleloader Season permit must use a muzzleloading rifle.





2006-2007 Special CWD Deer Season Results

Length: 3 days (concurrent with Late-Winter Season)

Number of Counties Open: 5 (Boone, DeKalb, McHenry, Ogle, Winnebago)

Special Regulations: Legal weapons were shotguns, muzzleloaders, handguns, or bows. County-specific antlerless-only permits were issued via lottery to Illinois residents from the IDNR Permit Office. Unfilled firearm, muzzleloader, and archery permits valid for open counties may also be used during this season. Persons using any of these permits must use the weapon(s) allowed by that permit, and only harvest the sex of deer allowed by that permit. Mandatory county check stations were used for harvest reporting. Hunters willing to allow sampling of their harvested deer for CWD testing were given a free either-sex permit so that they could continue to hunt. The limit of 2 antlered deer was waived during this season.

Harvest: 621 (new record)

Previous Record: 203 (2005, the first year for this season)

Harvest Sex Ratio: 37.0% male: 63.0% female (19.3% antlered: 80.7% antlerless)

Harvest Age/Sex Summary (All Seasons)

At mandatory check stations, age and sex of harvested deer were recorded by IDNR wildlife biologists. For all other deer reported via the automated harvest reporting system, deer were placed into age classes based on morphological data reported by the hunter. Age classes were female adult (≥ 1.5 years), female fawn, male adult (≥ 2.5 years), male yearling (1.5 years), and male fawn.
