Project Description:

This is a planning grant. No on-the-ground work will be completed as part of this grant. The Board of Trustees of the University of Illinois seeks support to conduct a planning and feasibility study to develop science-based policy and management practices that promote long-term, region-wide solutions to the emerald ash borer on stakeholder properties within the Illinois Coastal Zone. The funding will support ecological surveys and inventories to assess existing site conditions, including impacts of EAB Infestation, in stakeholder properties. The grantee will use the information on existing conditions, in conjunction with stakeholder priorities, to develop actionable, management-driven management plans using best practices and effective policies to counter the devastating effects of EAB. Recommendations are expected to include removal of invasive species and restoration of tree and shrub seedlings.
